Arthur's Next Step

Thanks to everyone's generosity Arthur was able to travel to Austria for his tube weaning treatment in February. We have now been back a month.

We hoped the treatment would mean that Arthur would become free of his tube and see him eating and drinking like all his friends. Unfortunately this is not the case, Arthur still has his tube but we only use it at night and he is slowly starting to taste food again. It is disappointing that we did not reach the 'ultimate goal' of being tube free but the treatment process has benefited Arthur dramatically. The therapies he received in Austria have meant that his speech, understanding and mobility have developed rapidly; all these treatments have not been available to us through the NHS. It has had a dramatic effect on our everyday lives. Arthur is now a much happier and calmer child as he can communicate his needs, he can move around with increasing ease and confidence, and most significantly he is no longer attached to a feeding pump during the day which means he can lead a more regular life!

The doctors in Austria observed behaviour from Arthur that concerned them, this was the reason the treatment wasn't 100% effective. They were concerned that he could be autistic, however it is more likely that he has a pervasive disorder associated with the trauma of his 10 months hospitalisation and constant invasive procedures. These procedures were always against his will so subsequently, when he is exposed to an environment that he is uncomfortable with, he reacts in a way that is not seen as typically normal. We are waiting for Arthur to settle at home before we pursue specialist opinions in this country.

We will stay in touch with the doctors in Austria because the journey to get Arthur to eat again is going to be a long one. They will help us through our efforts to tube wean Arthur at home.

Thank you once again for your support and interest in Arthur and our lives.

Parish Council Update

May saw elections for local and parish councils across the country. In Mawsley, we had 7 individuals stand for the 7 positions, so no election was needed. I'd like to welcome to the Parish Council, Fran Leah and Clare Farthing. Having now endured their first Parish Council meeting, it's clear they'll both bring a lot to our group. Cliff Moreton has left the Parish Council to successfully campaign to join the Borough Council and we wish him well in his new role. I doubt that's the last we've heard of him! Janet Redman is planning to move out of the village so decided not to stand. Again, we wish Janet well and thank her for her valuable contribution while with us. I've now been elected as Chairman as Bob Littler has decided not to stand for that role this time. Bob's done a superb job of keeping the firebrands of the Parish Council in check for the last 8 years and I hope to be able to continue his good work. Huge thanks to Bob for his time in the chair and thanks also to the other councillors for their vote of confidence in my ability, either as a chairperson or a sacrificial lamb. Not sure which yet!

Many of you will know already, that the appeal hearing for Taylor Wimpey's application to build houses on the land adjacent to The Centre (known as the pub site), will take place on 7th June. The hearing starts at 10am, at Kettering Borough Council's offices, and it's important as many people as possible turn up. This will show to the planning inspector, who will ultimately decide on the appeal, the strength of public opinion, supporting the huge number of objections registered. Many people are already sharing transport there and I'll have spare seats if anyone wants a lift. Let's pull together on this and show just how much we don't want this development, on top of all the other 'extras' we've had to accept.

Finally, we still hear comments about how we don't engage enough with the village and there's not enough communication. Unfortunately, it's difficult from our side of things to see where we're missing the mark, if indeed we are. Information is available on the notice boards in The Centre and round the village, the village website, here in the newsletter and can also be gained by attending a Parish Council meeting. This has been mentioned a number of times in previous newsletters. The meetings are open to the public and, while they're not the most exciting event in your social calendar, can be very useful in gaining an insight into what's going on at any point in time. If you don't want to sit in on a meeting but want to bring something to the Council, then contact an individual councillor (an updated contact list will be on the notice boards shortly) or e-mail mawsleyclerk@tiscali.co.uk.

If anyone has any comments or suggestions as to how we might improve in this area, please don't hesitate to get in touch. We're your council after all.

Maintenance and the Adoption Process

In view of the recent petition and understandable concerns regarding the maintenance issues and the status of the adoption process with Taylor Wimpey, it is appropriate to outline the problems and events over the last couple of years.

For villagers that have lived in Mawsley for several years, it would have been reasonable to expect adoption to have taken place progressively after four years from the start of the development. Unfortunately, this did not happen and because of this situation we began to experience a deterioration in maintenance...street lighting, pot holes, trip hazards and lack of gritting in the winter months.

This situation prompted complaints to Taylor Wimpey, Kettering Borough Council and Northamptonshire County Council which were supported by Parish Council. Because of the difficulties and lack of empowerment by all three councils to enforce action on the developer, we felt it was necessary to involve our MP, Philip Hollobone. As a direct result, Mr Hollobone was successful in obtaining a parliamentary debate in the House of Commons in November 2009. Mr Hollobone, in the debate, highlighted the shortfalls in effective control and legislation in planning agreements and the adoption of developments.

Since that time and within my role as Transport and Highways Volunteer, we were able to have formal meetings with the senior site managers for Taylor Wimpey. This resulted in repairs to pot holes, trip hazards and street lighting plus a commitment to the adoption work starting with Phase One [Broughton Road] and provision of winter road gritting by NCC. Unfortunately, this progress has stalled and TW have only just resumed with Phase Two. Phase One took 12 months to complete and the adoption work is scheduled in six phases!

The Parish Council has tried to progress these issues for some considerable years but the lack of accountability from Taylor Wimpey and the County Council means there are still many issues outstanding, including...the adoption of the pond and its future conservation which was offered to the village by TW in July 2010 and the future landscaping maintenance and conservation of the ancient hedgerows at Cowslip Hill, Loddington Way and Hawthorn Avenue. I trust that the petition will be effective in assisting a resolution to these problems.

Bus Service

At the Northampton County Council consultation meeting on the future of public transport held on Monday the 16th May, it was confirmed that our bus service has been retained on a commercial basis by Stagecoach.

This means that despite the withdrawal of financial support by NCC, Stagecoach have committed to run the service. This is all the more reason for its continued usage and support.

Bus Shelter and Further Route Extension

Taylor Wimpey have not responded to our request for the dedication of the land at the proposed Loddington Way site. NCC and Stagecoach have not made a decision on the further extension of the bus route.

What no Pub in Mawsley Village? Ever?

Can a "traditional Northamptonshire village" the size of Mawsley have no Pub?

That is the question that a Government Planning Inspector will be being asked to decide on at a Planning Appeal to be held at Kettering Borough Council offices on the 7th (and possibly the 8th) of June 2011. My resounding answer is NO! Mawsley must have a pub and it should be on the site set aside since the plans were first publicised in the early 1990s. The Borough Council's planning committee refused permission for the pub site to have houses built on it and the applicants have appealed against that decision. If they are successful the chance to complete the village with a village centre pub will be lost forever.

It is a public appeal and you are able to both attend and listen or ask to speak at the appeal hearing. Perhaps the inspector will ask for people to "club together" and have a spokesperson rather than a number of people repeating the same points, but demonstrating the weight of opinion by being there to listen to the proceedings is just as important. Whether you wish to speak or simply listen to others it is best to arrive at the beginning on the first day. I have written a statement and sent it to the Inspector and if you would like to have a copy email me on jimhakewill@kettering.gov.uk or phone me on 01858 467686.

If you share my view that we were promised a pub, that there is no village in Northamptonshire of Mawsley's size that doesn't have at least one pub, that even if there is no operator to take it on now the site should remain designated for one in the future, then turn up and show the Inspector just how importantly you view this issue.
