Peter Thomas, Chair of Mawsley Parish Council said,

'The school's brilliant idea is to try to present the children, and some of the wider community, with an opportunity to 'Try Something New', which will hopefully instil the very spirit of the Olympic games themselves. Not the spirit of competition, but rather the joy of effort, respect, teamwork and fair play. So they will take the children to places they might not otherwise go to, to try sporting activities they may never have thought of, with a view to simply enjoying themselves. If they then develop a new interest or talent as a result, then so much the better. The Parish Council is delighted to have been able to support them'

Bob Littler, MVA, said,

We are keen for the village's children to get the most out of their life in Mawsley. So we have made a donation to the school to help pay for the Olympic Project. We hope it sparks interest in new activities; maybe in 2020 or 2024 it will have been the catalyst for a GB gold medal!





Try Something New!

Mawsley CP School are very excited about the up and coming 2012 Olympics in London this year and plan on utilising this world class event to inspire our children at Mawsley and our wider community.

Our Olympic project will begin this term where each year group will be spending every Friday afternoon learning about a different country from around the world. They will research an Olympic athlete from their chosen country to learn about, they will be studying an art form from that country and creating a performance piece also based on their country chosen. At the end of term we will be inviting our community into school to come and share some of the work the children have been producing throughout the term in Friday brain boost sessions.

We will be trying this year to embed the Olympic Values into our curriculum at school and working hard with the children to open their minds to what the Olympic and Paralympic Values are really about and how they can demonstrate them in their every day lives.



These values will be the key focus of brainboost sessions at the beginning of the summer term. We will be asking the children to think about how they demonstrate these values in their everyday lives.

As part of the project we are inviting our parents and local community to demonstrate 'courage' and 'inspiration' to our children by attending one of our adult workshops held for one morning only on Friday 20th April. We are asking for adults in the community to become role models by trying something new for a small contribution of £3 per class. We have a wide range of topics to meet all interests - see aside.

In our final summer term we will be putting these values to the test! Every week for 6 weeks on a Monday afternoon every child will have the opportunity to try a new sport. We are very excited about this especially as we are able to offer this to all children at no cost to themselves due to the fantastic financial support we have received from the Friends of Mawsley School, The MVA and The Mawsley Parish Council. We appreciate and thank them all very much for believing in our project!

We are looking forward to giving you more details about the project and how you can be involved in the next newsletter.

I'm not exaggerating when I say it was inspirational to hear them talk about their plans, and particularly to see their looks of joy and relief when we unanimously agreed to their request for £4,500 to help fund the many coach journeys necessary to make their dreams a reality.

We wish all those involved the very best of luck with their plans. We really hope it all comes together without too many hitches. And by the way, you didn't need to look quite so relieved. With such a well-presented and enthusiastic plan, we'd never have dreamed of saying no!

Inside the centre of The Centre

(Continuing to look at issues we face in running The Centre)

Promoting The Centre

I have been a user of The Centre since it opened; I run the weekly Under 5s group, and have also organised some events - such as last year's Harvest Ball.

Jane and the volunteer directors had often said that the only way to reduce the subsidy the village pays to fund The Centre's community activities was to promote The Centre. Because what community groups pay to use the hall doesn't cover even half of the cost more business has to be found. The more people know it is an ideal venue for parties - for young and old and in-between; for wedding receptions and christenings; in fact for all kinds of social events which make use of the excellent bar, the more revenue it can generate.

However it was also clear that the demands on Jane's time of day-to-day running The Centre meant she was simply not able to spend enough time promoting it and organising events. I am now employed by The Centre on a part time basis to focus on raising its profile and so develop new business; and to help organise events.

At the moment we are producing banners which are displayed on the A43 at the roundabout for Mawsley. This produced fantastic results for the Wedding Fayre which we held last month.

We are carrying a half page advert with Village Connect and the Brixworth Directory, events are mentioned on Radio Northampton and in the Kettering Evening Telegraph. All our events are advertised in the Four Spires magazine and events for children are featured in the Mawsley School newsletter. We have recently produced a new website - www.thecentreatmawsley.co.uk which not only carries details of all events but also has information about our regular user groups, the TV schedule, photographs of The Centre etc. If you become a friend with 'The Centre at Mawsley' on Facebook you will be able to keep up to date with all event information. Buy to Let - Is it time to think again?

To compare different property's value use their yield, that is annual rent received as a percentage of the purchase price. You should easily achieve 5%, far more than your money will get in a bank currently.

Finally, choose an agent to help you. Their advice is free and you do not have to go for a High Street presence as many independent agents offer an excellent and personal service.



The purpose or role of the Mawsley Sports Council, as stated in our constitution... 'is to manage the sports usage and development for sport of Mawsley's playing fields, in an equitable manner; and to ensure good communication between the various clubs who use the fields and The Centre at Mawsley.'

The objectives of the Sports Council are to manage the day to day usage and maintenance of the sports pitches and lead the strategic development of the current, and potentially additional, pitches.

In particular to:

improve the quality of the pitches;

work together in a co-ordinated manner and to ensure equitable use of the limited resources;

develop the current facilities, and seek to add to them;

raise funds for maintenance and development of pitches; allocate those funds;

promote the value that the Sports Council brings to the village;

manage the tenure of the pitches.



Village works are on the road to completion - report from Taylor Wimpey

Taylor Wimpey is continuing its work in the village and behind the scenes to ensure Mawsley's public facilities and infrastructure are concluded as soon as possible.

Progress is being made towards completing the main infrastructure roads, with the final surfacing of School Road and Cowslip Hill due to take place soon and works also starting on Cransley Rise. Meanwhile, every effort is being made to finish off the village's remaining roads for the convenience of residents.

Elsewhere, the adoption process is taking place as planned for the last sections of the village's storm water network and foul water pumping station to be handed over to Anglian Water.

Negotiations are also progressing with Kettering Borough Council for the transfer of the open space areas currently under Taylor Wimpey's ownership. Further maintenance works will take place on the wildflower meadow before the council can take possession of this land.

Some elements of the infrastructure and public amenity works have taken longer than expected due to the recent bad weather and a number of logistical problems, which Taylor Wimpey is working hard to resolve. In the meantime, Taylor Wimpey would like to thank Mawsley residents for their patience and understanding.

MAWSLEY BIRD WATCHING - 2 CATS & BIRDS DON'T MIX

Cats hunt and they like birds. This article will show how birds may safely feed in most gardens. You need either:- a) a Cat Proof Garden or

b) to make feeders less vulnerable

Cat proofing. Raise the height of boundary fences, cheaply, by fixing expanding, narrow, trellis horizontally along the top, with cut points upwards. Ensure there aren't any gaps between fence and trellis – don't expand the trellis to its maximum or small cats may penetrate your new barrier. Across any other gap in hedge or fence fix cheap, green mesh net/filament which can be stretched or shaped or cut to any length or width you need – cats hate mesh. The same material is also effective at the bottom of gates and doors and can be stapled or nailed into any gap without supports.

Proprietary anti-cat products can be quite useful over a short time while you are helping to persuade a cat(s) to reroute away from your new defences. When a cat does get in, after you have gone to these efforts, shout at it, bang something or throw water at it. It will soon get the message.

Vulnerability. Cats can't fly, birds do. Bird feeders should be sited where it is almost impossible for a cat to reach, for example -

End of a branch Garage gable end

Clothes line Each end of T pole over 8' high

Screwed on a wall 6' up

If you ground feed the birds with bits of bread/toast/biscuit/crumbs, consider putting a wire cage over the food that birds can get in and out of but cats cannot.

Nesting birds needs protection. Small garden birds don't live very long lives: two or three winters is a pretty long time, so the bird population needs several broods per family whenever conditions permit. When pruning in Autumn or Spring try to leave enough branches/vines/stems so that they can be leaf covered very early each year as the temperature rises and birds can get leaf cover from magpies and rooks for their nests.
